These books can be seen at the museum and library reading room. Toyo Bunko has a restaurant "Orient Cafe".

History of Nippon Medical School, and its predecessor Saisei Gakusha

Saisei Gakusha, the predecessor of Nippon Medical School, was established in 1876 (the 9th year of the Meiji period), a few years after the Meiji Restoration, with the purpose of rapid training of doctors, and which produced many medical professionals and medical researchers.

The Saisei Gakusha Gallery exhibits some historical materials related to graduates, including Chuta Oguchi and Hideyo Noguchi.


