

Bunkyo "MUSE NET" Map 2024

Bunkyo City is home to a number of unique museums and many gardens rich in green. Why not take a walk, map in hand, to appreciate the historical sites, art, and nature? The map is organized by area and highlights recommended facilities and relevant information.



Koishikawa Area

- 8 Koishikawa Annex, The University Museum, The University of Tokyo. The Museum of Architecture within the oldest school building of the University of Tokyo. **Long-term closure (reopening date to be determined)**
- 31 Botanical Gardens, Graduate School of Science, The University of Tokyo. 4,000 different species of plants and trees are preserved in their natural forms.

Hakusan/Honkomagome Area

- 11 Inoue Enryo Memorial Museum, Toyo University. Toyo University's historical materials and art objects are on display.
- 12 Toyo Bunko Museum. This museum features a complete set of materials that enable visitors to get a good understanding of Asian history and culture. Enjoy seasonal flowers such as cherry blossoms, azaleas, and autumn leaves as well as the change of the landscape throughout the year.
- 34 Rikugien Gardens

Nezu/Sendagi Area

- 13 Nippon Medical School Saisei Gakusha Gallery. Take a look at the monument of the former residence of Soseki Natsume with a title written by Yasunari Kawabata, which is located on the premises.
- 15 Insect Museum of J.H.Fabre. You can see insects super magnified with a unique tool "Mushi Mega Ne-Kun". Trace the history of Mori Oga's life at the permanent exhibition, and learn about the various undertakings of Mori Oga through exhibitions held four times a year!
- 17 Mori Ogai Memorial Museum
- 23 Santaro Iwata Collection Kindonichikan Museum. This museum preserves almost 800 works of Santaro, the last successor of Edo Ukiyo-e Bijin-ga.
- 24 Takehisa Yumeji Museum. This museum has a collection of 3,300 works by Yumeji Takehisa, with themed exhibitions held four times a year. In addition, the unique temporary exhibitions are very popular.
- 27 Yayoi Museum
- 29 The Former Kusuo Yasuda Residence and Gardens. You can enjoy Japanese gardens and over one-hundred-year-old Japanese architecture.

Yushima/Hongo Area

- 2 International Origami Center. You can see a craftsman hand-dyeing "Washi" (Japanese paper) at the studio.
- 5 Yushima Seido. You can feel the spirit of "Edo" surrounded by a lush green in the center of Tokyo.
- 6 Museum of Health and Medicine, The University of Tokyo. A museum introducing the latest research of medical science and health care at the University of Tokyo.
- 7 The University Museum, The University of Tokyo. You can enjoy intellectual experiences through a numerous collection of academic specimens.
- 9 Tokyo Waterworks Historical Museum. Free entry and audio guides. We also offer guided tours (For groups of at least 5 people/advance reservations required).
- 10 Toyo Gakuen Archives, Toyo Gakuen University. The tile mural Phoenix Mosaic facing Iki-zaka by Architect Kenji Imai.
- 16 National Archives of Modern Architecture, Agency for Cultural Affairs. Drawings, sketches and related materials of modern Japanese architecture of international note are collected, preserved, and displayed.
- 18 Bunkyo Museum. Enjoy learning about the history and culture of the Bunkyo city through actual and visual materials.
- 19 The Mitsubishi Archives. You can watch the video "The history of Mitsubishi" at the lobby.
- 21 The Museum Wadatsuminokoe. The exhibit includes visual materials and documentary films that are available for viewing in the audiovisual corner.
- 25 Tokyo Arts and Space Hongo. Art space building originally built in 1928 to be used as an employment agency.
- 28 Kyu-Iwasaki-tei Gardens. There are information boards with history and highlights in various places.

Sekiguchi/Mejirodai Area

- 1 Printing Museum, Tokyo. At the printing workshop "Printing House", you can experience the technique of letterpress printing with metal movable types.
- 14 Japan Women's University Naruse Memorial Hall. You will get information about Japan's first women's university in this memorial hall.
- 22 Eisei Bunko Museum. The museum has about 94,000 art and historical works, including 8 national treasures and 35 important cultural properties. The building is also a must-see.
- 32 Hatoyama Hall. Enjoy cherry blossoms and gorgeous roses in the spring, and fragrant roses and fall colors in the fall.
- 33 Higo-Hosokawa Garden. In the lush green Japanese garden, the Japanese maple leaves turn a beautiful red from late November.

Korakuen/Kasuga Area

- 3 Gallery AaMo. We hold exhibitions of various genres that change every 1 to 3 months.
- 4 Kodokan Judo Museum & Library. Learn about Judo history at the museum, then go up to the top floor and watch Judo practice in a grand Dojo, 500 tatami mats in size.
- 20 The Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum. Right of Tokyo Dome Gate 21. The museum also has video theaters and libraries.
- 26 Japan-China Friendship Center Museum. In organized exhibitions, Various exhibitions and events focusing on Chinese culture are held here.
- 30 Koishikawa Korakuen Gardens. There are information boards with history and highlights in various places.
